### **What do our staff do to ensure they are always learning too?**

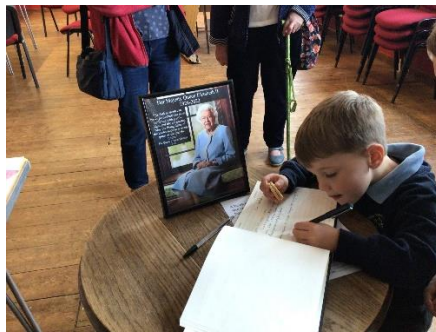
Our staff are continuously attending courses, updates and reviewing practice.
